French explorers were sailing the coast of WA in the 1700s at the same time as the British. They mapped the coastline and gave their names to landmarks still in existence today. To explore this history, the Western Australian Museum is putting together the 'French Connection Program', two exhibitions about the voyages of French explorers Nicolas Baudin and Louis-Claude De Freycinet.


These exhibitions are just part of the work the WA Museum is doing to bring the heritage and history of the State to the public. As a Festival sponsor, the WA Museum will present several events in the program.

WA Museum Kids Village is the fun centre of the Festival. Kids can enjoy activities, workshops and play around the inflatable castle while learning more about nature, marine archaeology and the French influence on WA history.

Curator and maritime archaeologist at the WA Maritime Museum, Nicolas Bigourdan, who is of French origin, will be at the Festival to talk about his research on the history of French exploration in Australia. He is the Coordinator of the French Connection Program which opens in September 2018 at the WA Maritime Museum in Fremantle.

In keeping with the French explorer theme, Perth French Theatre will perform the story of Rose De Freycinet, a French woman who, over 200 years ago, explored the Australian coast with her husband, Louis-Claude de Freycinet. Developed in collaboration with the WA Museum, this performance is sure to delight the audience.



As they enter the Festival space, Perth's French culture enthusiasts will be greeted with the sight of five themed villages dotted across the smooth green lawn of Market Square Park. This new concept will expose the audience to the diverse cultures that make up French culture.

The themes — Rustic, Alpine, Mediterranean, Urban and Creole — are brought to life with the design and decorating talents of Stella Sulak, Director of Perth French Theatre, and her dedicated team of volunteers.

Nestled around their own central square, the village stalls will offer food, drink, kids activities and entertainment associated with their theme. Festival goers can immerse themselves in the atmosphere of an Alpine village surrounded by snow-covered cottages while eating 'saucisson' and in the next moment enjoy exotic dishes in the Creole village.

In the Urban village the crowds will count down the end of the day as the Eiffel Tower bursts into light.

There will also be other areas in the park that focus on art (fine arts, visual arts, theatre, dance, literature), children, and well-being.



BISTRO FELIX, SUBIACO

As diners settle at dark wood tables and flick crisp white serviettes over their knees, Bistro Felix sets the scene for an experience in European food with an emphasis on classic French cuisine. Since opening in 2007, restauranteur Jeremy Cariss has offered Perth diners a chance to enjoy a sophisticated yet affordable menu.

French art deco vintage posters from the 1930s adorn the walls and in their theatrical presence diners can choose from an impressive menu that includes favourites such as duck confit, steak tartare, 'boeuf bourguignon' and braised lamb. Regulars will advise you to try the Chocolate Soufflé but it is also recommended that you indulge in the nutty warmth of a Frangelico affogato, an Italian delight. The wild berry crumble cheesecake with Chantilly cream will also entice.

The restaurant's extensive range of local and international wines is largely due to generous contributions from Cariss' own cellar. A wide range of cognacs is also available. Tastings are organised every week with a daily happy hour 4-6pm.

This year Bistro Felix won the European Excellence Award for its cuisine.

BLOODY FRENCH, SUBIACO

Paris-born chef, Boubakar Barrie, opened his restaurant, Bloody French, in 2016, riding the wave of culinary revival in Subiaco. After training as a chef in the French tradition at the École de Paris des Métiers de la Table, Boubakar worked at the Hilton. He decided to improve his English and left for London to work in a restaurant with an English team. After 11 years in London, he left the UK for Australia after meeting his wife, an air hostess from Perth.

Classic French dishes such as raclette, bouillabaisse and cassoulet await diners in the cozy surrounds of Bloody French. Apparently the bouillabaisse is the one that seduces Australian diners to be fans of French cuisine. With a largely French-speaking team, you will have a range of French music as a backdrop to your meal.

MEEKA, SUBIACO

Meeka is a warm embrace between the deep flavours of middle eastern spices and the adventurous spirit of Australia. Leah Clarke and her mother, Faye Clarke, opened Meeka ten years ago at the top of Rokeby Road, and the restaurant's winning fusion cuisine — Moroccan, Lebanese and Turkish with a modern Australian twist — is still going strong.

Authenticity is paramount at Meeka and is reflected in a menu inspired by Leah's extensive travels in the Middle-East. Although Faye has retired to Paris, she stills brings culinary inspiration to the restaurant from her travels around Europe, not to mention excellent additions to the wine list.

Most dishes are designed to be shared; a must as this food is just too good to keep to yourself. The tagine with lamb, extremely tender and slightly spicy, koftas and hummus are served in traditional dishes directly imported from Morocco.

The desserts arrive in a blaze of colour. Share a plate of the Apple Lemon Cardamon

Sour Cherry Doughnuts and for the gluten intolerant, the Dulce De Leche Panna Cotta with a Pumpkin Mousse ensures you don't miss out.


